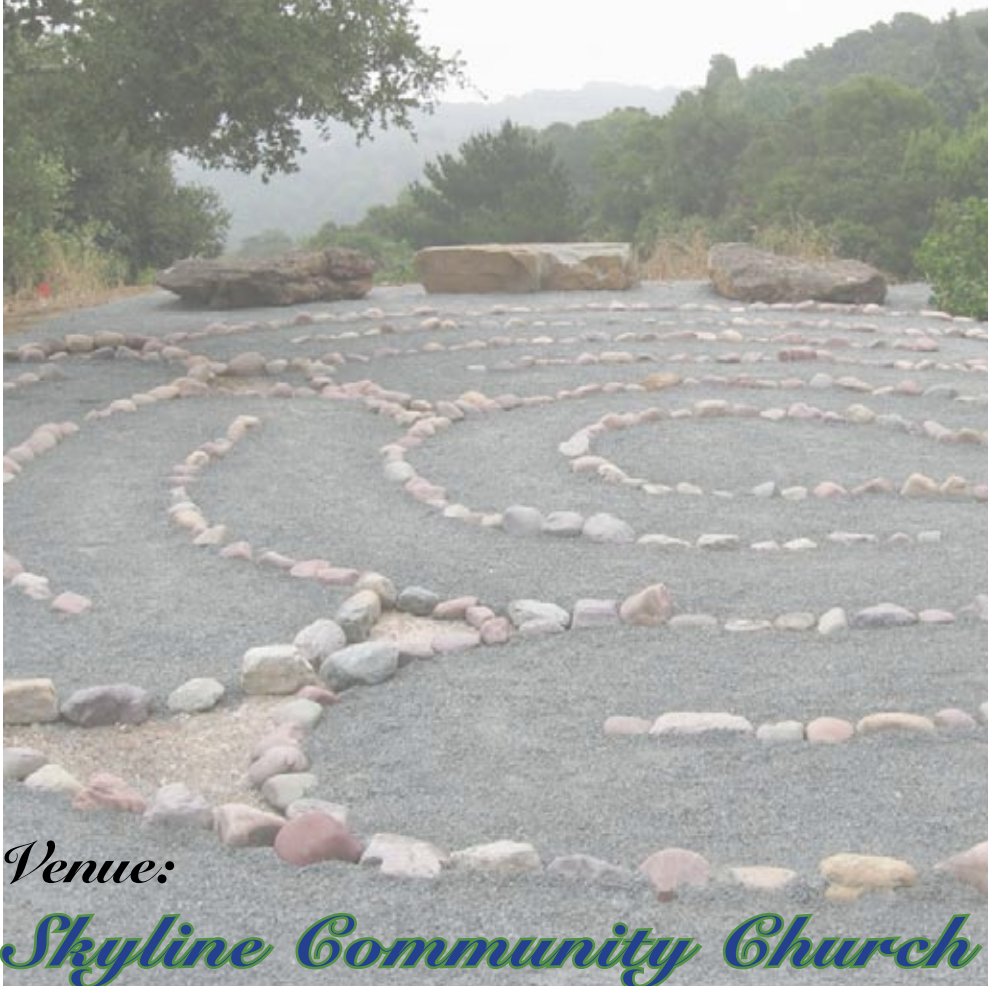

In this season of springtime, and in search of renewal and peace, you are invited to join us on Sunday, March 14th at 5:45pm to experience the beauty and peace of Taizé chant and Labyrinth walking.

What is Taizé?

Taizé is a contemplative style of worship developed in Taizé, France, in a monastic community developed to break down barriers between Christians. The Taizé style of worship features short meditative songs, played by our musicians, which are easily learned and sung repetitively; these songs then become a deep prayer encompassing the depths of our beings. You are invited to participate with an open spirit in this experience of prayer.

What is a labyrinth?

The term labyrinth is often used interchangeably with "maze", but modern scholars of the subject use a stricter definition. For them, a maze is a tour puzzle in the form of a complex branching passage with choices of path and direction; while a single-path labyrinth has only a single path to the center.

Why combine them?

Both Taizé chants and walking the labyrinth are means of centering ourselves more deeply, finding peace, and direction.
